

NOTICE OF ELECTION AND NOTICE TO SUBMIT ARGUMENTS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that special elections will be consolidated with the November 3, 2020 Presidential General Election for the purpose of voting on the following measures:

Measure G

For general revenue purposes, including the improvement of essential County services such as road maintenance, crime prevention, and environmental regulation, shall the measure establishing maximum cannabis activities tax rates not to exceed \$7.00 per square-foot for cultivation canopy area and 8% of gross receipts for all other cannabis activities, in unincorporated Calaveras County, generating an estimated \$1.5 - \$3,000,000 annually, with all funds used locally and annual audits, unless/until repealed, be adopted?

Measure H

Under a no-tax-rate-increase financing plan, shall the Calaveras Unified School District measure to renovate and improve aging classrooms and schools, including: career technical education facilities, heating, air conditioning, plumbing and electrical systems, and access to modern technology, authorizing \$32,800,000 in bonds, be adopted, with legal rates, estimated levy averaging less than 4 cents per \$100 of assessed value (\$1.8 million annually) through 2050, citizen oversight, annual audits, and no funds spent on administrator salaries?

Measure I

Under a no-tax-rate-increase-financing-plan, shall Vallecito Union School District’s measure to remove asbestos from school buildings, repair dry rot damage, and renovate the track and field at Avery Middle School by authorizing \$2.8 million in bonds be adopted with an estimated levy for these bonds of less than one cent per \$100 of assessed valuation averaging \$252,000 raised per year anticipated through 2036, at legal rates, with annual audits and independent citizen oversight?

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that arguments for or against the above measures will be accepted in the office of the County Clerk, Election Division, at 891 Mountain Ranch Road, San Andreas, CA 95249. Arguments shall not exceed 300 words in length and shall be titled either “Argument In Favor Of Measure \_\_\_” or “Argument Against Measure \_\_\_.” Arguments must be filed no later than 5:00 p.m. on, July 24, 2020.

A ballot argument shall not be accepted unless accompanied by the name or names of the person or persons submitting it or, if submitted on behalf of an organization, the name of the organization and the name of at least one of its principal officers. No more than five signatures shall appear with any argument. All arguments must also be accompanied by a statement that the argument is true and correct to the best of his/her/their knowledge and belief.

If more than one argument for and one argument against the measure is received, the selection will be made pursuant to the provisions of the Elections Code 9166.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that if an argument in favor of and an argument against the measure is submitted, copies will be mailed to the respective authors. The authors may prepare and submit a rebuttal argument not to exceed 250 words in length. Rebuttal arguments must also be accompanied by a statement that the argument is true and correct to the best of his/her/their knowledge and belief. The deadline for filing a rebuttal argument will be 5:00 p.m. on August 3, 2020.
